# Cablemagoria *Knit Along*

**Welcome to the start of the Stylecraft Cablemagoria Blanket Knit Along designed for us by Stuart Hillard. Designed in five colourways, the blanket can be made in Special Aran, Highland Heathers Aran and Grace.**

Over the forthcoming weeks we will be bringing you a new panel every fortnight (2 weeks). The dates for your diary are:

**11th October, 25th October, 8th November, 22nd November & 6th December.**

The patterns will focus on one panel every fortnight and you will need to complete 2 of the same panels apart from Part 3 where you only need to complete 1 panel.

We will set out at the beginning of each part which colour and equipment you will need. We will always repeat abbreviations at the beginning of each pattern. The step by step images within the patterns have been shown in Ocean, using Special Aran. The completed panels in the other four colourways will be shown at the end of each pattern.


There are 5 different panels that, when joined together create a blanket of the following size depending on the yarn you choose:

**Special Aran:** Approx width 120cm x length 140cm (47½in x 55in)

**Grace:** Approx width 114cm x length 140cm (45in x 55in)

**Highland Heathers Aran:** Approx width 126cm x length 140cm (49¾in x 55in)

- Part 3 – Double Staghorn with Simple Four Stitch Cables
- Part 4 – Raised Chain on Reverse Stocking Stitch

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## Part One - Cable Twist

### You will need...

- 1 pair of 5mm (UK 6 - USA 8) knitting needles
- Cable needle

### Abbreviations

**cm** centimetre(s); **g** grammes; **in** inch(es); **K** knit; **mm** millimetres; **P** purl; **RS** right side; **st(s)** stitch(es); **WS** wrong side.

### Tension

#### Special Aran:

28 sts measure 12cm, 4¾in over panel on 5mm needles or the size required to give the correct tension.

#### Grace:

28 sts measure 11cm, 4½in over panel on 5mm needles or the size required to give the correct tension.

#### Highland Heathers Aran:

28 sts measure 13cm, 5¼in, over panel on 5mm needles or the size required to give the correct tension.

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
## Part One - Cable Twist

**Cable 1, position at each side edge...furthest right and left...make 1 with cable twist to the right and 1 with cable twist to the left**

**Cable Twist to the right x 3 (or Cable Twist to the left x 3)**

Cable twist to the right or left (x 3)... this is the easiest of all cables to work and pops up in just about every cable pattern out there! It's made from a simple column of stocking stitch which twists around itself like a rope and the best news is, the knit and purl stitches are exactly the same throughout the entire pattern! Keep in mind that one band has cables which twist right and the other has cables that twist to the left.

**C6B explained...** slip next 3 sts onto a cable needle and hold at back of work, Knit next 3 sts then Knit the 3 sts from the cable needle.




**C6F explained...** slip next 3 sts onto a cable needle and hold at front of work, Knit next 3 sts then Knit the 3 sts from the cable needle.

## Part One - Cable Twist

C6F explained...



### Pattern

#### Cable twist to the right... (make one of these)

With 5mm needles cast on 28 sts

**Row 1 (RS):** K1, P2, (K6, P2) 3 times, K1

**Row 2:** P1, K2, (P6, K2) 3 times, P1

**Row 3:** K1, P2, (C6B, P2) 3 times, K1

**Row 4:** As row 2

**Row 5:** As row 1

**Row 6:** As row 2

Repeat rows 1-6 until your band measures 140cm (55in) ending with a WS row. Cast off in pattern.

#### Cable twist to the left... (make one of these)

With 5mm needles cast on 28 sts

**Row 1:** K1, P2, (K6, P2) 3 times, K1

**Row 2:** P1, K2, (P6, K2) 3 times, P1

**Row 3:** K1, P2, (C6F, P2) 3 times, K1

**Row 4:** As row 2

**Row 5:** As row 1

**Row 6:** As row 2

Repeat rows 1-6 until your band measures 140cm (55in) ending with a WS row. Cast off in pattern.
