Welcome to Part 2 of the Stylecraft Cablemagoria Blanket Knit Along designed for us by Stuart Hillard. Available in five colourways, the blanket can be made in Special Aran, Highland Heathers Aran and Grace.

Over the forthcoming weeks we will be bringing you a new panel every fortnight (2 weeks). The dates for your diary are:

8<sup>th</sup> November, 22<sup>nd</sup> November & 6<sup>th</sup> December.

Part 2 will focus on a Triple Nine Stitch Plait. You will need to make 2 panels and they use stitches C6B and C6F, as in Part 1, so you should be familiar with these techniques. Don't worry though, they will be explained in the step-by-step pictures again.

We have set out at the beginning of Part 2 which colour yarn and equipment you will need. We always repeat abbreviations at the beginning of each pattern. The step by step images within the pattern have been shown in Ocean, using Special Aran. The completed panels in the other four colourways are shown at the end of the pattern.


The 5 different panels when joined together create a blanket of the following size depending on the yarn you chose:

**Special Aran:** Approx width 120cm x length 140cm (47½in x 55in)

**Grace:** Approx width 114cm x length 140cm (45in x 55in)

**Highland Heathers Aran:** Approx width 126cm x length 140cm (49¾in x 55in)

- Part 2 Triple Nine Stitch Plait
- Part 3 Double Staghorn with Simple Four Stitch Cables
- Part 4 Raised Chain on Reverse Stocking Stitch
- Part 5 Wide Lattice

### Part Two - Triple Nine Stitch Plait

Learn to Cable with Stuart Hillard and Stylecraft

#### You will need...

1 pair of 5mm (UK 6 - USA 8) knitting needles

Cable needle

#### Yarn Usage



#### **Abbreviations**

cm centimetre(s); g grammes; in inch(es), K knit; mm millimetres; P purl; RS right side; st(s) stitch(es);
WS wrong side.

#### **Tension**

#### **Special Aran:**

37 sts measure 16cm (61/4in) over panel on 5mm needles or the size required to give the correct tension.

#### **Grace:**

37 sts measure 15cm (6in) over panel on 5mm needles or the size required to give the correct tension.

#### **Highland Heathers Aran:**

37 sts measure 17cm (6½in) over panel on 5mm needles or the size required to give the correct tension.

# Cablemagoria Init along

### Part Two - Triple Nine Stitch Plait

## Cable 2, directly to the left and right of Raised Chain, position 3 (3rd from each edge)...make 2

#### **Triple Nine Stitch Plait**

This is a nice easy cable pattern to work; another easy cable to learn and a very simple repeat.

The knit and purl stitches stay in the same place throughout the pattern and it's very easy to learn!

#### **Pattern**

With 5mm needles cast on 37 sts

Row 1 (RS): K1, P2, (K9, P2) 3 times, K1

Row 2: P1, K2, (P9, K2) 3 times, P1

Row 3: K1, P2, (C6B, K3, P2) 3 times, K1

Row 4: As row 2

Row 5: As row 1

Row 6: As row 2

**Row 7:** K1, P2, (K3, C6F, P2) 3 times, K1

Row 8: As row 2

Repeat rows 1-8 until your band measures

140cm (55in) ending with a WS row.

Cast off in pattern.

**C6B explained...** slip next 3 sts onto a cable needle and hold at back of work, Knit next 3 sts then Knit the 3 sts from the cable needle.















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
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
**C6F explained...** slip next 3 sts onto a cable needle and hold at front of work, Knit next 3 sts then Knit the 3 sts from the cable needle.




